



AN AREA STEEPED IN HISTORY

Florida boasts a fascinating history dating back to the mid-16th century, when intrepid pioneers braved a most hostile environment to settle in what has become the Sunshine State. Sarasota first became a "modern" town in the 1880s after a promotion in Scotland by the Florida Mortgage and Investment Company in 1885. For many, it presented a breath of fresh air, promising an abundance of fertile land, plentiful citrus groves and affordable housing. Scottish families looking for a new start set sail for Sarasota, but found little more than a frontier camp upon their arrival. However, among those who stayed to complete their dream was John Hamilton Gillespie, a Scottish aristocrat, lawyer, and member of the Royal Company of Archers, Queen's Bodyguard for Scotland.



It was Gillespie who is believed to have built America's first golf course, right here in Sarasota. Quite the entrepreneur, Mr. Gillespie also built the upscale DeSoto Hotel on Main Street for tourists and prospective investors. In 1902, he was elected as Sarasota's first mayor.

By the winter of 1910, Sarasota had a population of less than 1,000 when a visit from Bertha Honore Palmer, a

wealthy Chicago civic and social leader, was the catalyst to help change the little town from a sleepy fishing village to a cosmopolitan village. Her declaration that Sarasota Bay was more beautiful than the Bay of Naples caught the attention of the press and visionaries who led residents to enjoy its tropical charms.

Today's Historic Spanish Point was once the posh waterfront winter estate and gardens of Bertha Palmer, widow of Chicago developer Potter Palmer. That's not all—what is now Myakka River State Park was once Palmer's 30,000-acre ranch in eastern Sarasota, called Meadowsweet Pastures.

SARASOTA THE CIRCUS TOWN


John Ringling, of Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey Circus, made his mark on the community with much more flair. Not only did he and his wife, Mable, build a magnificent Venetianstyle mansion on Sarasota Bay—named Cà d'Zan (house of John)—but they went a few steps further in positioning Sarasota as "Florida's Cultural Coast."

John and Mable needed a place to house their ever-growing collection of works by Peter Paul Reubens and other masters of 17th-century Italian and Flemish art. We know that collection today as the John & Mable Ringling Museum of Art, one of America's most celebrated art museums.

Ringling's influence didn't stop there. As a developer and dreamer, Ringling used his circus elephants to help build the first bridge from the mainland to St. Armands Key, where he went on to develop a commercial and residential center.

In 1927, the circus' winter quarters were moved to Sarasota—branding the area as a "circus town."

SARASOTA COUNTY

Anna Maria Island and Holmes Beach offer a laidback, barefoot elegance befitting its quaint beach-town atmosphere. Along the revitalized riverfront and within the vibrant downtown, restaurants, boutiques, and a variety of science and natural history exhibits provide an exciting center of fun and discovery. The internationally acclaimed IMG Academies offers a multi-sport training facility and a range of residential options for some of the world's top athletes. Golf courses, polo grounds and a bustling Main Street greet the residents of Lakewood Ranch, an 8,500-acre master-planned community made up of seven

gorgeous villages. From charming Old Florida bungalows and magnificent waterfront estates to luxury condominiums and stately country club communities, Manatee County is sure to have the right home for every taste.

CHARLOTTE COUNTY

Situated along and around the sparkling Charlotte Harbor, the communities of Charlotte County—Port Charlotte, Englewood and Punta Gorda—reflect the unique ambiance of the area, graced with unspoiled beauty and favorable lifestyles perfect for both full-time residents and vacationers. Port Charlotte has more than 165 miles of waterways, many with access to Charlotte Harbor and the Gulf of Mexico. There are miles of natural shoreline bordering Charlotte Harbor and the Peace and Myakka Rivers. The City of Punta Gorda boasts a charming and historic waterfront town, while its residential areas feature brick-lined streets shaded by old royal. Straddling both Sarasota and Charlotte counties, Englewood residents delight in an array of recreational activities framed by some of the world's most beautiful tropical surrounds.

World Class Beaches

While some areas are internationally recognized for their architecture or skyscrapers, Florida's Gulf Coast is most widely known for one thing: gorgeous beaches. For both residents and visitors from around the world, Florida's Gulf Coast beaches make spending time in our area truly special. With miles of soft, white sand lapped by gentle azure waters, each day is a tropical respite capped by a glorious sunset folding softly beyond the shimmering horizon.

SARASOTA COUNTY

Blind Pass Beach - Blind Pass Beach is located on Manasota Key Road, one mile north of the Charlotte County Line on Manasota Key. Amenities include rest rooms, parking, playground equipment, canoe launch, nature trail, large picnic shelter, and dune wildflowers. Please note that no lifeguards are on duty.

Brohard Beach - Brohard Beach is located in the southern most part of the City of Venice, on the Venice Airport property on Harbor Drive. This park is owned by the City of Venice and operated by Sarasota County. If you enjoy fishing for recreation, there is a 740-foot fishing pier on the property for public use. The pier contains rest rooms, a snack bar, and a bait shop.

Caspersen Beach - Caspersen Beach is located south of the Venice Airport on Harbor Drive. As you visit this beach, you will find that the southern two-thirds of beachfront have been left in their natural state. Many people describe it as uncultivated, windswept and secluded. A dune restoration system with walkovers has been implemented to preserve the shoreline. Restrooms, picnic tables, and showers are available, but no lifeguards are on duty.

Crescent Beach - Noted for its soft, white sand and crescent shape, Crescent Beach extends from the northern tip of Siesta Key and south past Siesta Beach to Point of Rocks. Relatively secluded and quiet, Crescent Beach has only one public access road.



Manasota Beach - Manasota Beach is located at the west end of Manasota Beach Road. This is a wonderful place to spend your leisure time whether you are interested in taking a walk, collecting shells, or maybe flying a kite. This beach is situated between the Gulf and the Intracoastal Waterway. As a convenience on the Intracoastal side, a boat ramp and docking facilities are available allowing access to the Bays and Gulf. The 620 feet of dockage becomes a scenic boardwalk that meanders through the mangroves. Lifeguards on duty.

Nokomis Beaches - To find the Nokomis beaches, turn west on Albee Road off U.S. 41 and cross over the Nokomis Bridge. Straight ahead, you'll find Nokomis Beach, with ample parking in two lots, lifeguards, picnic tables, grills and bathrooms. To your right is Casey Key.

North Jetty Beach - North Jetty Beach is located on the southern tip of Casey Key. The jetties make this one of the most exciting surfing beaches on the west coast of Florida. It is a very popular picnicking spot for families and large groups, and the fishing is spectacular. If you enjoy watching boats, this is a good place to engage in that activity. Boats can be seen daily as they pass through the jetties from the Intracoastal Waterway to the Gulf of Mexico. Amenities include rest rooms, parking, bait shop, large and small picnic shelters, horseshoe courts, volleyball courts, concession, and dune walkovers. For your safety, lifeguards are on duty year round.

North Lido Beach - North Lido Beach is a gorgeous half-mile stretch of beach and is the area's most famous beach. 77 acres of land including over 3,000 feet of sandy beach located at the northern tip of Lido Key on the west side of Westway Drive.

Palmer Point Beach - Palmer Point Beach begins at the southern tip of Siesta Key and continues onto the north end of Casey Key. The northern portion of this beach was previously the home of Mote Marine Laboratory. The closing of Midnight Pass in January of 1984 has created one continuous beach from the northern portion to Casey Key. This beach will give you a feeling of privacy and seclusion. It is a beautiful, gently sloping beach with a pristine dune system. The beach is a popular spot for boaters and people who like to walk along the shore from Turtle Beach. Two things to make note of if you are visiting: there are no lifeguards on duty, and there are no facilities present.

Lido Beach - Located mid-island on Lido Key and only minutes from St. Armands Circle, the facilities here are outstanding. Besides the beautiful sand and sea, also provided are showers, lockers, dressing rooms, a 25-meter swimming pool, concession stand, public meeting rooms, beachwear souvenir boutique, and children's playground.

Longboat Key - Longboat Key is for those who prefer seclusion. These pristine beaches are a well-kept secret and public access is at a minimum. Undeveloped sandy beach extends from North Shore Road, south to county line and accessible only through residential street ends.



Siesta Public Beach - Located mid-island off Midnight Pass is where the action is and where you'll find the world's finest, whitest sand. It's the widest beach in the county and certainly the most popular, continually ranked as one of Stephen Leatherman's (Dr. Beach) best beaches in the nation. On its busiest weekends you'll find more than 15,000 people there. Facilities include a concession stand, restrooms, volleyball nets, tennis courts and year-round lifeguards. Pine trees shade an area for picnicking, with grills for cooking out and a playground for the children. This sparkling white beach is also within walking distance to Siesta Village, a shopping and dining mecca with an island flair.

South Lido Beach - Located at the south end of Ben Franklin Drive, at the southern tip of Lido Key.A 100-acre park interacts with four significant bodies of water: The Gulf of Mexico, Big Pass, Sarasota Bay and Brushy Bayou. The southern beach portion of the park offers expansive views of downtown Sarasota and the Gulf of Mexico. Lifeguards, restrooms, picnic tables and showers.

Turtle Beach - Turtle Beach is a tranquil spot located on the southernmost tip of Siesta Key on Midnight Pass Road, about two and one-half miles south of Stickney Point Road. Less crowded than Siesta Beach, it is a wonderful place to spend a few hours sunbathing, reading or picnicking under its covered shelter.

Venice Beaches - Fossilized sharks' teeth are the main attraction at Casperson Beach, near the airport off Harbor Drive in Venice. It also features a fishing pier, nature trail and a restaurant. If you want to sunbathe on smooth, white sand or enjoy crystal-blue waters, Venice Public Beach, at the end of W.Venice Ave. off Hwy 41, offers picnic benches, restrooms and outdoor showers.



CHARLOTTE COUNTY

Don Pedro Island - Located at the south end of Little Gasparilla Island, accessible via private boat. Restrooms and picnic tables are available.

Englewood Public Beach - Located at the Beach Road at Manasota Key Road in Englewood. Concessions, restrooms, picnic tables and showers are available.

Stump Pass Beach - Located at the south end of Manasota Key Road, on Manasota Key. Restrooms are available.

MANATEE COUNTY

Anna Maria Bayfront Park - On the northern end of Anna Maria Island is a secluded beach that fronts both the Intracoastal Waterway and the Gulf of Mexico. According to the locals, this is the best beach in the area for finding unbroken sand dollars and scalloped cockleshells. Sunbathers discover small sand dunes, sea oats and a great view of the Sunshine Skyway Bridge. Park-goers can enjoy amenities such as a barbecue pit, picnic shelters, a playground, restrooms, showers and lifeguards.

Coquina Beach - On Anna Maria's southern tip, is a lovely and popular public beach lined with towering Australian pines. Families can enjoy this park because of its full-service concession stand, ample parking, barbecue pits, picnic facilities, boat ramp, playground, restrooms, showers and lifeguards.

Cortez Beach - Also known as Bradenton Beach, is located just north of Coquina on Gulf Blvd., and boasts three-fourths of a mile of sugarwhite sand. Restrooms, lifeguards, and free parking available. Also enjoy a restaurant and snack bar that even serves pancake breakfasts on weekends.

Greer Island (Beer Can Island)

- Greer Island at the north end of Longboat Key is accessed by boat or North Shore Blvd., and is a beautiful, secluded peninsula with a wide beach and excellent shelling. No facilities or lifeguards are available.

A WARM HOME FOR PROFESSIONALS

Since the early 1900s, Sarasota and professional baseball have been a great match. In 1923, John Ringling helped convince the owner of the New York Giants to come to Sarasota to practice during the spring months. Through public subscriptions, a stadium was built and the team came on February of 1924. Since then, Sarasota has been home to the Indianapolis Indians, Boston Red Sox, Los Angeles Dodgers, Chicago White Sox, Cincinnati Reds, and currently the Baltimore Orioles. Now, each spring season provides the opportunity to see some of baseball's best right here in Ed Smith Stadium. Sharing the Suncoast sunshine are the Pittsburgh Pirates, who play each spring just north in Bradenton.


A NAUTICAL PLAYGROUND



MOVING GUIDE CHECKLIST BEFORE YOUR MOVE

One-two months before....

- Put together a 'moving book' to keep notes of what you need do, what you've done etc.
- Buy a file to store all the documentation and paperwork associated with the move.
- Find and book a moving company.
- If you need to use storage facilities look at your options and book it.
- Make a list of everyone you need to notify of your change of address.
- Contact key financial providers such as your bank or other institutions to have your details changed and to start up the process of cancelling/setting up automatic payments and/or accounts, etc.
- Notify schools and employers of change of address.
- Start packing non-essential stuff (it's never too soon to begin!) whenever you have some free time.
- If you have pets, Contact the State Veterinarian's Office or State Department of Agriculture requesting the pet laws and regulations of your destination state.
- If you have a pet carrier, get your pet accustomed to the carrier several days before a flight or car ride by using it as a bed.
- Buy, hire, beg, borrow or steal suitable boxes and containers to pack your stuff into.
- Talk to your doctor, dentist, veterinarian etc., to notify them of your change of address or to come off their books if necessary.
- Contact all of your insurers (home, vehicle, medical etc) to notify them of your move.
- Get a lockable box and start putting in important documents as you come across them.
- Give all service providers such as gardeners, domestic help and regular delivery services notice that you will be moving. Cancel or change any subscriptions or memberships you have.
- Send out change of address notices to friends and family if you have a firm moving date now.You'll have less time as the days pass so it's good to get this out of the way.

- Start making an inventory of your goods and take photos/videos of valuable items.
- Complete any repairs to your home that you are committed to.

Two-three weeks before.....

- Contact utility companies and service providers to arrange to have your appliances/services disconnected and, if necessary, reconnected in your new home.
- Move your packing up a gear. Take a room a day and start packing up stuff you don't use regularly.
- Request necessary documents from your veterinarian for your pet.
- Take back library books, pick up drycleaning and think about any other similar things you may have pending in the area.
- Have your car(s) serviced.
- Start living off your store cupboard and freezer and stop buying frozen or perishable food - you can't really take it with you and it'll make the move easier.

- Don't worry about filling wardrobes immediately if you have hired/bought special wardrobe boxes. They can hang perfectly well in there until you have time to put them away properly.
- Get all of your major appliances ready for use again.
- Unpack all electrical items as quickly as possible and check for damage - you may have a limited window for insurance claims.
- Check your mail is being forwarded to your new address.
- Register with a doctor, dentist, veterinarian, etc.
- If necessary change your driver's license and car details, etc.

YOUR FLORIDA DRIVER'S LICENSE

The State of Florida requires newcomers who drive to apply for a Florida driver's license within 30 days of becoming a resident. Drivers who currently possess a valid out-of-state driver's license and have a driving record free of violations are only required to pass a vision test. Drivers who have offenses against their license or drivers attempting to acquire a license for the first time must also pass a written exam (based on the Florida Driver's Handbook) as well as a driving test.

AUTO REGISTRATION

If you are moving to Florida, the state's law requires that you register a vehicle within 10 days after engaging in an occupation in Florida or enter a child in a Florida school. You need to first obtain a Florida driver's license. Next you need to obtain auto insurance from a company licensed in Florida. Many auto insurance companies licensed in Florida provide online services. At the DMV you'll also need your original out-of-state title and VIN verification.

When you are issued a motor vehicle registration you will receive a license plate, vehicle registration certificate and validation decal.

FLORIDA HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION

A tax exemption is an important benefit that offers Florida residents the opportunity to save up to hundreds of dollars in property tax bills. The homestead exemption is the most common and valuable exemption, providing savings every year a homeowner owns and resides in their primary home.

Florida's constitution provides for a \$25,000 exemption, which is deducted from a property's assessed value if the owner qualifies. Every person who owns and resides on real property in Florida on January I and makes the property their permanent residence is eligible to receive a homestead exemption up to \$50,000. The first \$25,000 applies to all property taxes, including school district taxes. The additional exemption up to \$25,000, applies to the assessed value between \$50,000 and \$75,000 and only to non-school taxes. Applicants who timely file by March I, possess title to the real property, and are Florida residents living in the dwelling and making it their permanent home as of January I, qualify for the exemption.





Sarasota Blues Festival – Held each fall at Ed Smith Stadium grounds, this nationally recognized event brings some of the top national and local blues musicians to the stage.

Florida Winefest and Auction is held in April each year. The Winefest is a week-long food and wine extravaganza and auction that benefits many local charities.

Cine World Film Festival is a November event of the Sarasota Film Society and presents a kaleidoscope of cinematic colors with the best films of the Toronto, New York and Cannes Film Festivals.

Fiesta on Main draws several thousand people to Main Street in downtown Sarasota. Mexican fashion, games, great food, live Mexican entertainment are scheduled. The event is timed to be close to Cinco de Mayo. fiestaonmainsrq.com

Bowls of Hope is an annual community event benefiting the All Faiths Food Bank of Sarasota. It is held shortly before Thanksgiving each year. For a donation, all of which goes directly to the food bank, patrons choose from a variety of soups and stews donated by Sarasota's best restaurants.

Circus Ring of Fame – This January annual event recognizes those persons who have made a significant contribution to the circus.

Classic Corvettes on the Circle – Held in the beginning of May, this is the among the largest classic Corvette car shows in the state of Florida.

Cortez Commercial Fishing Festival – The annual Cortez Commercial Fishing Festival is the main fund raising vehicle for the Florida Institute for Saltwater Heritage. This two-day event is held the third weekend of February every year. Cortez is located on the northern edge of Sarasota Bay. Live music, nautical arts and crafts, children's activities, environmental exhibits, tons of fresh seafood and, of course, beer. **Downtown Sarasota Festival of the Arts** – Held in February each year the Annual Downtown Sarasota Festival of the Arts is one of the area's biggest art events. The event is held along Main Street in downtown Sarasota, spanning from Five Points-Selby Park to Orange Avenue.

Giving Hunger the Blues is an annual food and music event held in May on Hillview St. in Sarasota's Southside Village. The event raises money for the All Faiths Food Bank and other charities. Local restaurants offer a variety of foods and there is live music throughout the day.

St. Barbara Greek Glendi Festival Takes place each February on the grounds of St. Barbara Greek Orthodox Church, 7671 North Lockwood Ridge Rd. Featuring Greek food, live Greek music dancing and culture. Free on-site & off-site Parking.

Holiday Night of Lights – The official kick off to the Holiday season, the December evening begins with the lighting of St. Armands' four story tall Christmas tree and the arrival of Santa Claus.

Suncoast Super Boat Grand Prix is a powerboat event held around 4th of July every year to raise money for the Child Development Center. Over the years the event has raised millions to build facilities in Sarasota including a Special Olympic training facility in Venice, FL.

Sandy Claws Beach Run – This popular annual event is held on a Saturday in December with race day registration beginning at the Siesta Beach Pavilion. It includes a 1-mile fun run and a timed 5K run for the more serious runners.



Sarasota Cunty Fair – Held in March every year the annual fair features 4H and agricultural exhibits, live entertainment, midway rides and games, lots of food, and more. More...

Taste of the Suncoast – Held in February is a fundraiser for the All Faiths Food Bank. Dozens of Sarasota's top restaurants and wine merchants donate their food and products to raise money to fight hunger in Sarasota.

Teddy Bear Run Annual Great Teddy Bear Run, sponsored by the Sarasota Florida HOG (Harley Owners Group) Chapter. This charity event is held in November and will benefit KIDS by the SEA, serving children with cancer.

Florida International Air Show is held each April at the Charlotte County Airport in Punta Gorda. Past performances have included the Navy Blue Angels team as well as a variety of vintage and modern aircraft such as a F-117 Stealth Fighter.

Venice Sharks Tooth Festival is held each April on the Venice Airport Festival Grounds. The event celebrates Venice's distinction as the shark's tooth capitol of the world and features entertainment, food as well as displays of shark's teeth and other prehistoric fossils.

The Venice Holiday Parade – Held at the end of November is the kickoff to the holiday season. The parade runs through downtown Venice and futures floats and marching bands.

Say "I Do" Again – Renew your wedding vows each Valentine's Day at Siesta Beach main pavilion.

The Sarasota Christmas Boat Parade of Lights is held each December in Sarasota Bay and features a competition of decorated power and sailboats in several classes. Some of the efforts are quite impressive with many involving thousands of lights. Best viewing from Bayfront Park in downtown Sarasota, FL.



Sarasota Downtown Holiday Parade – Held each the first Saturday of December in downtown Sarasota and features floats, music, marching bands and lots of fun. A tradition since 1996, there are thousands of participants and brightly decorated floats, several live marching bands playing songs of the season and parade entries from school and community organizations as well as area businesses.
